The route of just under 26 miles will mainly take place in Herefordshire and Gloucestershire but you will dip your toes into Worcestershire as well. You will be allocated a start time on 10th July between 09:30 & 10:30. Earlier start times may be available on special request.

It is not a race. Competitors arriving at the finish in handcuffs / accompanied by Police, will be disqualified.

In the event that two (or more) teams have exactly the same number of correct answers the decision will be made by The Judge on the best Limerick which has a connection to Wellington Heath in some way. It is suggested you start thinking of your Limerick in advance!

A Limerick consists of five lines arranged in one stanza. The first line, second line, and fifth lines end in rhyming words. The third and fourth lines must rhyme. Something like this:

*Pool Piece had just been mowed
And safe in the brook, there sat a Toad
He waited and waited, but had no kiss,
The village lasses, all gave him a miss,
Preferring the Frog, who lives on Horse Road.*
